

#### FOREWORD

Labour weekend 2004 sees the celebration of 125 years of the Weedons Cricket Club. The Weedons Cricket Club can be very proud of its achievement when one considers the recent celebration of 125 years of Canterbury Rugby.

The Weedons Cricket Club which originally started on a very small scale back in the eighteenth century is now numerically the strongest club in the Ellesmere Association. I recall times in the 1980's when the senior team struggled to field a side, at times playing with 9 or 10 men or boys. Around those times the efforts of one C.E.M. (Charlie) Tilson were instrumental in the survival of the club. A period of rebuilding followed, with our young senior side struggling to win or even draw games. By the early 1990's the club showed an amazing resurgence boasting 3 senior and 9 junior teams. Team numbers have remained high over the last 10 years with outstanding success in both junior and senior competitions.

My first memories of Weedons Cricket go back some 40 years when I regularly went to games with my father, Athol. Occasionally I was required to play when the team was short. The season highlight however was the annual preseason game against the J.C. Saunders town team which always included a number of Canterbury and New Zealand representatives. This event was one that a young cricket enthusiast would look forward to for weeks.

Having been involved in the club for such a long period of time it is very pleasing to see the continuing successes of our teams. I congratulate all of those players who have received representative honours and thank all of those administrators and coaches who have willingly given so freely of their time to make our club something special.

All of those who participate in the 125<sup>th</sup> celebrations will I am sure enjoy discussing their cricketing memories of years gone by. I would also like to take this opportunity to wish all of our present players a successful and enjoyable season.

## WEEDONS CRICKET CLUB ONE HUNDRED & TWENTY FIVE YEARS

The Weedons Cricket Club was founded in 1879, and it is of interest to note some of the first people involved in its establishment. Mr T. McLellan was the first Patron, Mr J. Fessey the first Captain and Mr T. Gudsell the first Secretary. The Original members were Messrs Fessey, Anderson, J. Taylor, I and R Watson, T and G Gudsell, A. Hay, J. Nankervis, Blacker and W. Ellis.

During the following ten years, activity was spasmodic, with few games being arranged against Templeton, Doyleston and Day's Road. Regular cricket did not begin until 1889. Members fees were fixed at five shillings.

Long serving Weedons families started their association with the club when Mr J. Curragh commenced his incredible term of almost 60 years as Secretary in 1893. He was succeeded by Ewart Chaterton who held the position for almost 30 years and over the last 25 years many people have volunteered their time to ensure the ongoing prosperity of the club.

The Weedons Cricket Club has always played on the Weedons Domain except during World War 2 when Weedons combined with Templeton to field a senior team. For the first few years the ground was covered with tussocks, which must have made the games interesting. The first pitch was laid in 1889, followed by a concrete pitch in 1920, which was latter converted to the composite pitch used today. The grass wicket developed by Graeme Hulston and club members in the early 1990's and is widely regarded as one of the better grass wickets in Ellesmere today.

It is a noteworthy event for any sports club to survive for 125 years. Undoubtedly the Weedons Cricket Club has had its ups and downs but thanks to the tenacity of its members the club now boasts strong junior and senior teams. The strength of today's club has emerged through the effort put into developing the Junior Section in the 1980's. This was strengthened in the 1990's and has ultimately resulted in the most successful senior side in the clubs long and illustrious history.

Weedons has boasted may fine players and naturally enough a number of characters since its foundation in 1879. The club has never been graced with quality of player that they have available today with seven of its current senior players having represented Canterbury Country.



#### **Memorable Moments**

My first game for Weedons was against Burnham on the Burrows Fields. Weedons was in its second innings and signs of defeat were ominous. Graham Trist was batting when I cam out to join him. We batted for a long period of time and Graham built a sizable total. During our partnership I managed to middle a ball, hitting it high and hard to mid wicket. Two Burnham players converged on the ball from opposite direction. I thought this is it, I'm on my way, but to everyone's amazement the two players collided head on in midair resulting in both players being knocked out cold. They were both transported to the Army Hospital by Army ambulance. Unfortunately their demise and my good fortune was not enough save us and we eventually succumbed to defeat.








The Weedons Form 1 & 2 Side has had considerable success winning the Wadsworth Cup on numerous occasions since its inception in 1983 as follows:

#### A.R. MACGIBBON BAT

In 1959 the Patron of the club Mr Tony MacGibbon presented a trophy to Weedons which is a great source of pride to the club. The trophy is the bat used by Tony during the test series in England in 1958, and is inscribed with the autographs of the England team which played in the 5<sup>th</sup> test at the Oval.

The bat is presented each year to the club member, administrator or player, who makes the best overall contribution to the club during the season. The bat is now a treasured historical club memento and the Weedons committee has decided that it is to be mounted in a glass case to preserve it for future generations and take pride of place in the club rooms.

#### WEEDONS CRICKET CLUB 1978-1990

My introduction to the Weedons Cricket Club in 1978 came about through Charlie Tilson who called soon after my arrival back in Canterbury after a stint of rural teaching in North Canterbury. My playing days over I thought, but Charlie rekindled my enthusiasm and I played regularly for the next twelve years.

It was significant that the after I joined the club it was the Clubs centenary year. There was a fantastic turn out of past players and supporters who were able to reminisce and reflect on past and present happenings. No doubt a key topic of discussion was the low playing numbers and the vulnerability of the clubs future. The Club was struggling to field each week in the senior competition, even though they had the nuclease of a very good team.

The Club needed to increase its player base and the obvious way to do that was to introduce junior cricket. The following year a team was entered into the 3<sup>rd</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> form competition and it is gratifying to see that some of these players are still active members of the Club today.

In 1981/2 the junior section was expanded to include a Primary A team. The development of the junior section of the Club was the catalyst for unprecedented growth with Weedons fielding Kiwi, Primary B, Primary A and 3<sup>rd</sup>4th form sides. This ensured we had an on flow of players into the senior ranks and ensured the Clubs future.

During this period of rapid growth Weedons experienced considerable success in all grades. I recall that the 3<sup>rd</sup>4th form team won the competition on at least two occasions and the Senior B team won the competition under a shroud of controversy. The players all assembled at the prize giving and looked forward to receiving their hard earned trophy. They had won all of their matches and had beaten their nearest rival outright. The winner was announced and to their dismay Weedons had not been awarded the trophy based on points forwarded. A protest was lodged and the Weedons B team was awarded the trophy a week later. My heart went out to those lads who had had their day of glory spoiled.

The Weedons Domain is the home of the Club and there is no finer setting for a ground in the Canterbury province. Surrounded by the Weedons Golf Course and shrouded in trees our home ground has an old English relaxing, idyllic atmosphere. The introduction of the grass wicket, the inspiration of Graeme Hulston, has further enhanced the character and the new practice wickets are a big improvement on the old fisherman's nets. The Club rooms have also undergone considerable upgrading over the years and helps make the Domain facilities more accommodating to all sports users. The Domains Board has been very active in supporting our Club and their assistance is much appreciated.

Weedons will always hold a special place in my heart. The friendships that I have built over my years with the Club and the fellowship I have enjoyed will always be treasured. I wish the Club all the best for the forthcoming 125<sup>th</sup> celebrations and look forward to following the Clubs progress in the ensuing years.

Charlie Tilson was a dedicated Weedons player and character of the Club. There are many stories that could be told about Charlie but the one that stands out is one of Charlie's last innings for the Club against Southbridge at Southbridge. Weedons batted all of the first day and a gloveless Charlie was on 91 at the close of play. This caused a dilemma, should we bat on, on day two to let Charlie reach his century, another milestone in his fine career. Eventually it was decided to bat for half an hour before a declaration would be made. When the batsmen were called in Charlie had advanced his score to 97. This innings was as good as you would ever see and considering Charlie was 54 years old it was a magnificent effort. His finesse and skill at the wicket were something to behold while his late cut was legendary.

and brother of Robin and Jeromy who also played for
us. Richard hadn't played cricket regularly due to his
professional soccer commitments but he relished playing this day. He hit a mammoth 167 with several towering sixes and many blinding boundries. Southbridge
collapsed badly in the chase thanks to three magnificent
catches by Richard. This was a rare win against one our
most formidable opponents and Southbridge were not at
all happy. This was the only game that Richard played
for our Club but he left enough wonderful memories to
preserve his place in the clubs history.

#### THE CRICKETING CHATTERTON'S

The Chatterton family have had a long standing influence on the Weeddons Cricket Club. The families involvement started in 1926 when Ewart started playing and he was joined by Cyril in 1932. These two were regulars except for 5 years when Ewart worked in North Canterbury. On his return he played continuously until the end of 1977, a career that spanned over 51 years.

Cyril spent three seasons playing at Tai Tapu whilst his parents resised in the district. He returned to Weedons before serving overseas. On his return from active duty he again played for Weedons. In 1958 Ewart's elder son Harold joined the team and in 1962 Percy Chatterton (Ewart's older brother) moved into the district and also played for Weedons.

When the Weedons team won the two day competition in the 1960/61 season there were three Chatterton's in the team. Ewart proved to be a very astute and successful captain for many years. He was joined by his two sons, Brian and Lyndsay in the side in 1963. Owen and Paul, Percy's two sons played schoolboy cricket for Weedons with Owen joining his father, uncles and cousins in the senior side until 1977 when he and brother Paul moved to Australia.

Ewart was assistant secretary and later secretary from 1949 until 1977. Cyril was the main attacking force, being opening bowler for many years with his offcutters. On his best season he took 43 wickets and was leading wicket taker in most seasons. The only time he another player took more wickets than him was when Percy Chatterton took 26 wickets, one more than Cyril.

Ewart, Cyril, Brian and Lyndsay Chatterton represented Ellesmere at senior level. Ewart, Cyril and Brian all took hatricks in their careers but Ewart was the only Chatterton to boast a century, scoring 102.not out.

In the 1968 season six Chatterton's took the field and on two occasions, seven were either Chatterton's or relations, the seventh being Stuart Rae, Ewart's son in law. The Chatterton men were ably supported by their wives who served up afternoon teas and assisted on opening days.

Ewart was also a noted batsman scoring almost 5000 runs for Weedons during his career.

The Chatterton's are a cricketing legend of the Weedons Cricket Club and I am sure they would be proud of the part that they have played in ensuring the clubs future which has resulted in today's success. All present and future players will be forever indebted to contribution of the Chatterton's, Tilson's, Hulston's and many other families that insured the longevity of the Weedons Cricket Club.

#### RECENT YEARS

During the 1990's and into the 21<sup>st</sup> century the Weedons has enjoyed some of it's most successful times on the field. The Ellesmere two-day competition has now been won Six times by Weedons in the course of it's 125 years.1927,1928,1961,1963 and for the first time again for over forty years in 2002-03 and last season 2003-04. Weedons won the Ellesmere one-day competition, which has been in existence since 1955, for the first time in 1991-92. This started the ball rolling and since then Weedons has won it four more times, in 1997-98, 1998-99, 2001-02 and 2002-2003. In addition Weedons won the Steve Ryan Memorial Trophy,(which is run on a challenge basis and has been competed for since 1993-94), for the first time in 2003-04.

To emphasize the success of the current team, a Canterbury Country wide club knock-out competition was introduced in 2002-03, with teams entering from Akaroa to Scargill. Weedons has won this competition both in 2002-03 and last season, beating Oxford in the final both times.

An interesting occurrence happened on the way to the final of this competition last season when Weedons came up against a very strong Sefton side (North Canterbury) in the first round. Weedons batted first and set Sefton a modest total and were nine down. Sefton paced themselves well needing a couple of runs off the last over, but with only one wicket in hand. Needing two to win the Sefton batsman (Dave Hay), miss hit the ball and set off. One run was scored easily and the scores were tied, both teams were nine down but Sefton had scored at a better rate in their first twelve overs so would win. But the Sefton batsmen didn't realise this and set off for a second run, only to be run out....Weedons win and make their way to the second round and eventually on to win the competition!

Going back to the 1990's, Weedons was fortunate to have the services of some very good players. In the early Nineties Trevor Patterson scored heavily, including two centuries, and took useful wickets. Jonathan Gall scored an amazing 180 in 1991 and to this day the player with the highest score in the club wins the trophy named after Jonathan. Bruce Agnew was Mr reliable with the bat and often propped up a batting order that had otherwise failed miserably. The Bromley brothers, Chris and Richard, Aaron Hooper and the Rose Brothers Nick and Bernard were also some very good batsmen. Todd Butts was an aggressive fast bowler, taking 7 wickets in an innings once, including a Hat-trick. (Todd took 5 wicket bags three times). Andy Garters was the main stay of the seam attack for many years

and continues to give service and must take the prize for taking the most four wicket bags, (Andy also has a Hat-trick in his 3 or so five wicket bags). Robbie Westland has been one of the most successful bowlers of all time for the club taking 11 five wicket bags, including several 7 and 8 wicket bags. To put this in perspective Cyril Chatterton took 24 five wicket bags, but over a much longer period.

As the decade progressed, Danny Barclay came into his own right. Danny has taken 12 five wicket bags with his off spinners (and some time outswingers), and scored 10 Centuries thus far. 1997-98 was a memorable season for both him and Chris Cherry. In that season Danny scored 4 hundreds and took 4 five wicket bags. He scored a total of 791 runs @ 65.91 and took 42 wickets @16.42. Not to be out done Chris Cherry scored 757 runs that season, which doesn't include a double century he scored for the Ellesmere Under23 side against an unfortunate Hurunui. Danny responded when a couple of seasons later and scored a massive 250 against the Hurunui senior side at Scargill. An unfortunate Stu Dixon having 100 taken off his bowling that day.

Cory Lelliott has taken 5 five wicket bags with his leg-spinners, and scored one Century since 1994. 1998-99 saw the emergence of a boy wonder. At 16 Shannen Dunnett, spun a web around Ellesmere club batsmen, taking 3 five wicket bags with his leg-spinners including Ten in one day against Burnham( in two innings). (Shannen has 5 five wicket bags thus far). Paul Rugg has been the glove man for Weedons for the last decade-plus and must go close to having the most catches and stumpings of any Weedons keeper. But he has missed plenty of games due to his regular appearances for Canterbury Country and has recently been rewarded with selection for the Canterbury First Class side. Well done to Weedons' first Canterbury representative.

Weedons had only one Canterbury Country representative before the 1990's, now they have Nine and arguably Ten: Todd Butts, Paul Rugg, Daniel Barclay, Cory Lelliott, Shannon Dunnett, Andrew Robertson (also Canterbury'B'),Peter Borren (also New Zealand Under19) and Paul Hutchison. Lewis Davies our English import of two seasons ago played one game.
